Historic Streetscapes

As noted in Harima no Kuni Fudoki (Historical records of the Climate and Culture of Harima Province), Murotsu Port enjoys good weather. Murotsu prospered after the Nara period (710-794 A.D.), reaching its pinnacle in the Edo period (1603-1868 A.D.) when feudal lords landed there on their travels to and from Edo (Tokyo). That past prosperity is everywhere to be found here.

Rofu Miki

Born in Tatsuno. Along with Hakushu Kitahara's Jashumon (Wicked Religion), his anthology Haien (Abandoned Garden) heralded a new style in poetic circles in Japan, ushering in the "Hakuro period". Published when he was 32, Akatombo (Red Dragonfly) is one of Japan's most beloved children's songs.

Tatsuno Castle

Castle built in 1672 by the feudal lord Yasumasa Wakizaka. Only the stone walls remained, but the hall of the inner tower, outer castle walls, main watchtower, fortified gateway, corner watchtower, etc. have been reconstructed. The room with raised floor (for the lord) is now the resplendent Ogon no Ma (Golden Room).

Shrine for the worship of Nomi no Sukune, the pioneer of sumo. Having died from illness in Tatsuno, a large number of people stood lined up in a field relaying the rocks to build his grave. "No ni tatsu hito" ("person standing in the field") and "tatsu no" ("standing field") are said to be the origin of the name, Tatsuno.

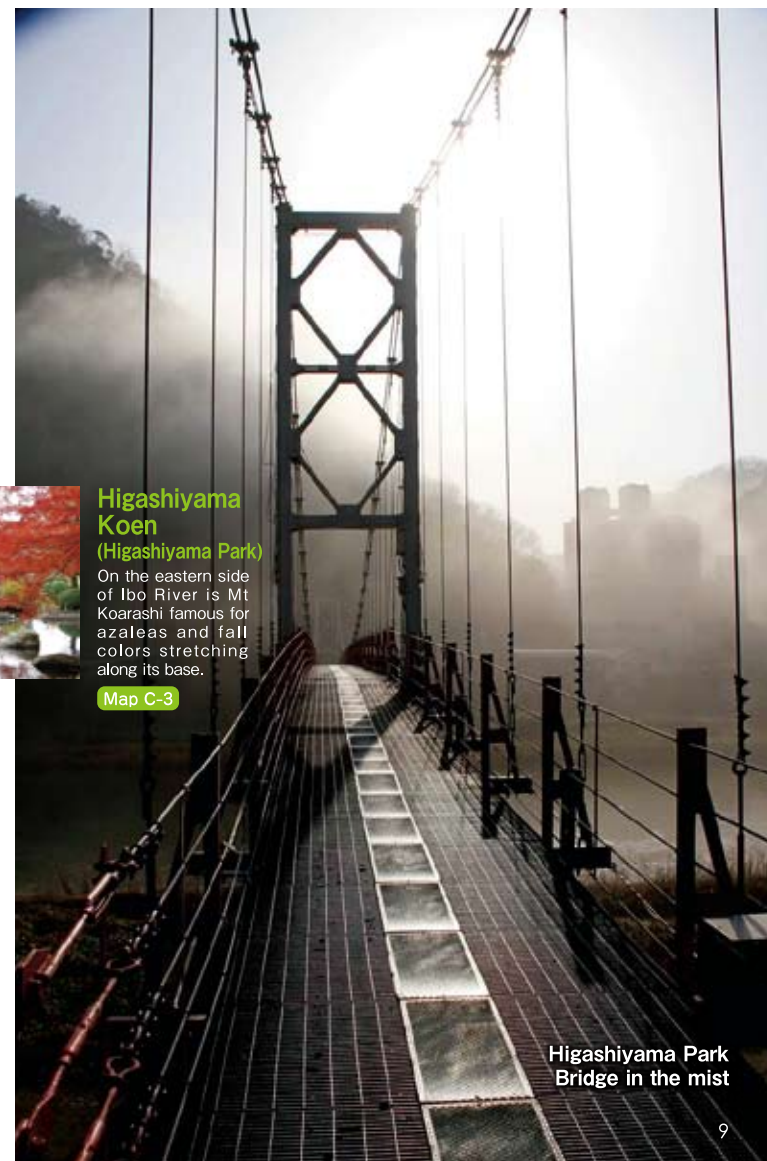

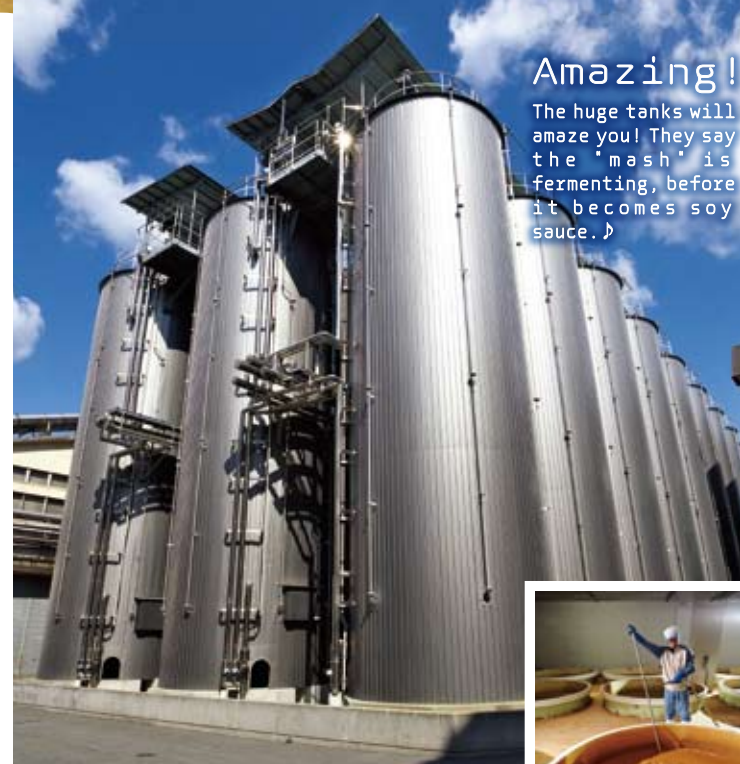

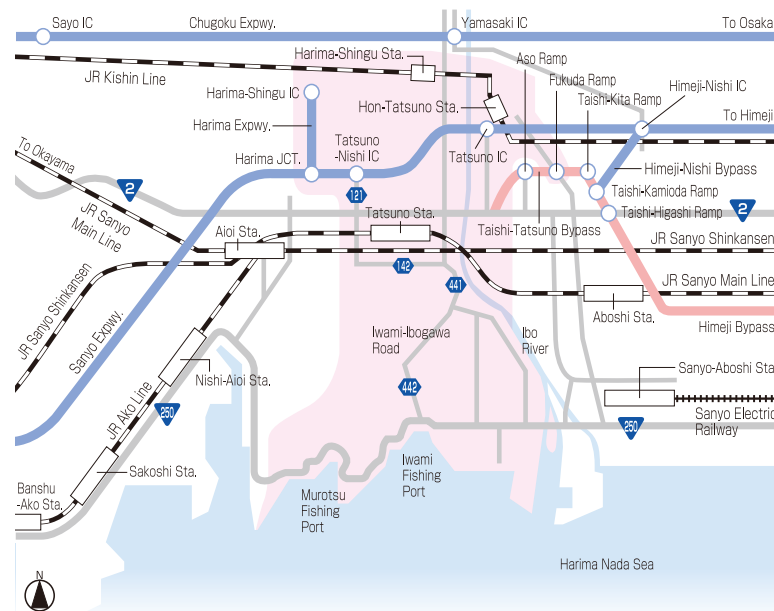
