

Historic Streetscapes

As noted in Harima no Kuni Fudoki (Historical records of the Climate and Culture of Harima Province), Murotsu Port enjoys good weather, Murotsu prospered after the Nara period (710-794 A.D.), reaching its pinnacle in the Edo period (1603-1868 A.D.) when feudal lords landed there on their travels to and from Edo (Tokyo). That past prosperity is everywhere to be Map L-3

built about 800-900 years ago. The shrine has a deep history: Taira no Kiyomori prayed here in the Heian period, and Siebold visited in the Edo period. Another sight on the shrine grounds is a rare wild grove of sago palms.

Tatsuno Castle

Castle built in 1672 by the feudal lord Yasumasa Wakizaka. Only the stone walls remained, but the hall of the inner tower, outer castle walls, main watchtower, fortified gateway. corner watchtower, etc. have been reconstructed. The room with raised floor (for the lord) is now the resplendent Ogon no Ma (Golden Room).
